He also flagged the relevant tables in each paper and recorded information about the nature of the event, the firm characteristics involved, and the statistical approach used to conduct inference from regression coefficients. Christopher's worked has helped inform a new working paper examining the challenges in conducting inference based on regressions of this type due to cross-correlations of stock returns across firms.
